BUILDING BRICKS

A Hands-on Activity About Socially-Normative School Behavior for Teens with EBD, ODD, and ASD

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School Skills Building Bricks

This is a neat activity on a lot of levels. Keeping hands busy building with Legos helps ease anxiety and fidgeting. The way the activity is written helps students practice when to give short yes/no types of answers in class and when to give longer, more expanded verbal responses. The activity could be rewritten to have a number of different variations/versions in order to address different social skills needs (something I plan to do). Finally, the activity helps students practice delayed gratification (having to wait to get another brick) and acceptance of limits (only being able to use the bricks you are given).

Supplies

- Lots and lots of building bricks in assorted colors (they can't all be grey). The exact bricks used to design this game are available on Amazon and are a great deal at about \$35 for 1,000 bricks. Purchasing the same set I used to design the game is helpful but not essential. If you're using different bricks, just change the color categories to fit what you have:

- Building brick bases (optional, but I think it controls some of the chaos and allows kids to walk away from their projects and move them to storage more easily if you run out of time). These are on Amazon for about \$14 for an 8-pack:

- Printed copy of the activity instructions and activity questions that you can mark on (to check off the questions you have used). I'd advise printing new copy each time or laminating your copy to make it reusable. If you have access to colored paper or cardstock that matches the colors of the bricks in the game, printing out the different sheets on colored paper that corresponds to the block color can make flipping through the sheets to find the right set of questions go more smoothly.
- Cups/paper plates/small containers. I'd suggest counting out exact numbers of starter bricks before class and putting them into a cup or something like that for each student in order to keep things moving quickly and ensure parity.

Duration of Activity: Approximately 50 minutes

Object of the Activity

Build a structure with only the interlocking bricks earned during the activity

Directions for Play

1. Provide each student with a cup containing 15 building bricks and (optional) a building pad.
2. Explain the beginning rules of the activity to students.
 - a. You must build only with the bricks you have been given or earn during the course of the activity.
 - b. When it's your turn, the teacher will draw a building brick from the bag/container of bricks.
 - c. Each brick color correlates to a different type of question.
 - d. Most of the colors will only require "true/false" or "yes/no" responses. For those colors, you will be able to earn one brick (the one the teacher drew out at the start of your turn). You will earn the brick by answering the question correctly.
 - e. For blue and turquoise bricks, you will be required to give a more detailed and lengthy response. On these occasions, you will be able to earn 5 bricks (the one the teacher drew at the start of your turn, then 4 more drawn by the teacher if the question is answered appropriately).
 - f. If you draw a black brick, it's a freebie (you just get the brick and don't have to answer a question).
 - g. If you draw a yellow brick, you must engage in a silly physical activity (ex. Sing "I'm a Little Teapot" with the hand gestures) in order to get 5 bricks (the one the teacher drew at the start of your turn, then 4 more drawn by the teacher if you do the activity). You can choose to "pass" if you don't want to do the activity, but you won't get a brick for this turn.
 - h. If you answer incorrectly/inappropriately, the brick drawn by the teacher will be returned to the bag/container.
3. Because the activity is non-competitive, there really are no winners or losers--just those who have more bricks than others.

Post-Activity Discussion Questions--THIS IS A VERY IMPORTANT PART OF THE ACTIVITY! DON'T SKIP IT!

- What were some of the challenges you experienced as you tried to build something with your building blocks? (Ex. It was hard to wait when I really wanted another piece. I didn't get the pieces I wanted. I felt jealous when other people got more pieces than I did. I couldn't build what I wanted to build with the pieces I drew. Etc.)
- When you felt frustration during the activity, what strategies did you use to cope with that frustration? If you managed frustration poorly, what could you do differently next time?
- How is this activity similar to the experience of life, in general? (Ex. You don't have control over all the things that happen to you, but you DO have control over what you do with the challenges and gifts you have been given.)

If you draw a TAN brick, you will answer one of these questions about student/teacher relationships.

- True or False? Most teachers are just waiting for you to mess up so they can jump your case.
- True or False? The best thing to do if you feel confused in class is to shut down and stop working.
- True or False? If your teacher has upset you, you should find a time to speak to him/her about it privately, outside of class.
- True or False? It bothers teachers when you leave your hand up for a long time while they are speaking.
- True or False? Teachers don't usually notice when you are using your laptop to watch videos instead of working.
- True or False? If you are absent, it is the teacher's job to make sure you know what you missed.
- True or False? Making off-topic comments in class is irritating to your teachers.
- True or False? Teachers don't mind if you show up without supplies like a charged laptop, pencils, and paper.
- True or False? If you get behind in a class, most teachers are unwilling to work with you on a plan to catch up.
- True or False? It's okay to use profanity when speaking to your teachers outside of class.
- True or False? If you think an assignment is stupid or boring, you shouldn't complete it.
- True or False? It is better for you to email your teachers yourself when you need them to change a grade than to have your parents e-mail them.
- True or False? Sloppy work that is difficult to read reflects poorly on a student in the eyes of his/her teacher.
- True or False? Teachers don't mind if you sleep in class if they know you feel tired.
- True or False? It's rude to put your head down during class.
- True or False? The perfect time to ask to go to the bathroom is when the teacher is going over instructions for an activity with the class.
- True or False? If you raise your hand for every question but the teacher doesn't call on you every time, it's probably because he/she doesn't like you.
- True or False? It's rude to eat noisy or messy snacks during class.
- True or False? Asking on-topic questions at appropriate times is a good way to contribute to class.
- True or False? The teacher has to pass you if you get at least half of the points possible on all your work.
- True or False? Having an intellectual debate as part of a class discussion is a positive way to contribute to class.
- True or False? Getting into a yelling match during a class discussion is just part of proving your point.
- True or False? Frequently being tardy to class is disruptive and annoys the teacher.
- True or False? Speaking louder, faster, and more urgently makes my teacher more likely to agree with me.
- True or False? If I keep asking the same question, eventually the teacher will give me the answer I want.
- True or False? It's okay to blow my nose loudly while the teacher is giving instructions.
- True or False? If the teacher tells me my answer to a question is wrong, I should get angry and argue.
- True or False? Most teachers are irritated if you show up to your first class of the day with a dead laptop.
- True or False? Eating in the classroom is your right as a student.
- True or False? Your teacher has no right to ask you to put away electronic devices because they are your personal property.

**If you draw a BLUE or TURQUOISE brick, you have drawn a BONUS BLOCK!
Answer the question thoughtfully and appropriately, and get a total of 5 blocks
on this turn.**

- During an episode of anger, you screamed foul names at your teacher and broke items in the classroom. What can you do to repair the relationship?
- You stole money off your teacher's desk and got caught. What can you do to begin to reestablish trust with your teacher?
- You have missed turning in several assignments in your Biology class, but you want to try to turn things around and salvage your grade. How should you approach your teacher to discuss your options?
- A friend is pressuring you to share your lunch, even though she has her own food and you don't have extra food to spare. How can you approach your friend to talk about the issue and stop her behavior?
- You put some words out on social media that get taken out of context. Now, several of your peers are voicing how much they hate you in several of your classes. How can you navigate this crisis while you wait for time to pass and things to blow over?
- Someone in your English class keeps asking you to hang out, but you don't really like them very much. How can you let them down easily so that class won't be awkward?
- You tried out for the soccer team and didn't make it. Several of your friends did. What is an appropriate response when your friends are excited and want to celebrate making the team?
- You want to hang out with a new friend, but he has a cat...and you're severely allergic to cats. How can you hang out with your friend?
- In class, the teacher is talking and going through presentation slides way too fast for you to keep up. What should you do?
- A good friend has really bad breath ALL the time but seems oblivious about it. How should you approach talking to her about the problem?
- You know you tend to talk too much at the wrong times. The guy who sits next to you in Math got annoyed with you and snapped at you to "PLEASE. Be. Quiet!" during a silent work time. What should you do?
- You got into a major physical fight at school and got suspended for three days. The person you fought with is in two of your classes. How do you handle having to be in class with this person.
- Your teacher has busted you messing around on your phone at inappropriate times and has asked you to place the phone on his desk for the rest of class. What should you do?
- You've been talking to another student in one of your classes a lot, and you seem to have a lot in common and to enjoy one another's company. You'd like to see if this person would like to be your friend. What next step can you take to move this person from the "acquaintance zone" to the "friend zone."
- You knocked over your drink and it spilled all over the floor of your English class. A couple of kids laughed. What should you do next?
- You missed your bus after school. What should you do?
- You missed your bus to school in the morning. What should you do?
- You had an emotional meltdown in a gen ed class (crying, yelling, etc.) and your case manager had to come help you go to the support room. You have to go back to class tomorrow. What should you do when people ask if you're okay?
- Doing the required state testing for school is stressing you out. While taking the test, you start to feel lightheaded, sweaty, and your heart starts pounding. What should you do?
- You didn't get to eat breakfast at home, and you've missed the cafeteria's breakfast hours. You know your behavior tends to be worse when you don't eat breakfast. What should you do?

- ❑ During a 90-minute block class, you start to get really agitated and can't seem to sit still. You feel like you're going to crawl out of your skin; you don't think you can take it in there for another second...let alone 40 minutes. How can you get yourself back under control so you can finish the class period?
- ❑ You've lost your favorite gel pen. You look over, and a girl in your class is writing with it. What should you do?
- ❑ You want to take some Tylenol at the Nurse's office for a headache, but, when you get there, she tells you that your parents haven't signed the release form, so she can't give you any. How will you get through the rest of the school day?
- ❑ You want to go to the snack machine during class. Your teacher says "No. Wait until passing period." You are really hungry now. What should you do?
- ❑ During state testing, you get a math problem you really don't know how to answer. You ask your teacher for help, and she reminds you that, because this is state testing, she can't help you with any of the problems on the test. What should you do?
- ❑ The teacher in your Math class has created a new seating chart, and you are in the very back of the room. You have an accommodation that says you need to sit up front so you can see the screen/board. What should you do?
- ❑ You hate English class with a passion, so you've been getting in trouble on purpose so the teacher will send you out of the room. Now, you have to attend a meeting with your case manager, the teacher, and your mom. What will you do during the meeting?
- ❑ Someone is walking very slowly in the hallway, and you're in a hurry. You can't seem to manage to get around him. What should you do so you aren't tardy to class?
- ❑ You can't get your locker open, no matter how hard you try. You've got stuff in there that you need. Now, what?
- ❑ You damaged your school-issued laptop charger by accidentally stepping on the connector. Now, it won't charge your laptop. What should you do?
- ❑ You and your mom had a huge screaming match right before school. Now, your mind is racing and your heart is beating and you know you cannot manage yourself in your first class of the day right now. What should you do?
- ❑ You finish a test early in class, and the teacher has a "no electronics on test days" rule. How do you occupy the rest of the class period?
- ❑ Your teacher comes up to you, annoyed, to ask why you aren't working on your essay in class. She forgot that you turned it in yesterday. How should you react?
- ❑ You sneeze, your gum flies out of your mouth...and into the hair of the girl sitting in front of you. What should you do?
- ❑ Your teacher compliments a classmate for her hard work and positive attitude. Not you. Deep down, you know you haven't been exactly doing your best, but it still stings. What should you do?
- ❑ You spill Doritos all over the classroom floor just as the dismissal bell rings. If you don't go right now, you'll be late to your next class. What should you do?
- ❑ You see your teacher and her husband out at the grocery store. How much social engagement is appropriate? Where's the line?
- ❑ You have broken up with your boyfriend/girlfriend. You still have two classes together. How will you manage being in class with him/her?
- ❑ You have a history of skipping class, so now a para has to follow behind you in the hall to make sure you get where you're supposed to go. This makes you mad. What should you do?
- ❑ You've gotten into a battle of wills with your teacher. He wants you to put away your cell phone. You don't want to. Everyone is staring, waiting to see what will happen. How can you end the standoff and still save face?

If you draw a **PURPLE** brick, answer one of these questions about hallway and lunchroom behavior.

- Do or Don't? Chew with your mouth open.
- Do or Don't? Wash your hands after eating messy foods like Cheetos or Takis.
- Do or Don't? Shove people who get in your way.
- Do or Don't? Run in the hall because you are late.
- Do or Don't? Wash your hands if you go to the restroom during lunch.
- Do or Don't? Use the restroom during passing periods instead of during class.
- Do or Don't? Spit phlegm in the drinking fountain.
- Do or Don't? Slurp your drink.
- Do or Don't? Wipe your mouth with a napkin between bites when eating.
- Do or Don't? Stand in a clump of kids so the hallway is blocked.
- Do or Don't? Leave your lunch trash all over the table.
- Do or Don't? Get mad if a teacher asks to see your hall pass if you're out of the classroom and it isn't passing period.
- Do or Don't? Bring stinky foods, such as tuna, in your sack lunch.
- Do or Don't? Take other people's food after they've asked you not to.
- Do or Don't? Discuss gross topics, such as bodily fluids or functions, in the lunchroom.
- Do or Don't? Yell profanity in the hallways during passing period.
- Do or Don't? Chew with your mouth closed.
- Do or Don't? Take manageable bites of food.
- Do or Don't? Carry a hall pass or bathroom pass if you are in the hallways and it isn't passing period.
- Do or Don't? Leave class without a pass to go to the Counselor or to see an administrator.
- Do or Don't? Go the wrong way in the lunch line.
- Do or Don't? Walk against the flow of traffic in the hallway.
- Do or Don't? Get mad when people walk too fast or too slowly.
- Do or Don't? Keep your head down and don't look up in the hallway during passing period.
- Do or Don't? Stop by the bathroom during passing period to wash your hands if they look/feel grimy.
- Do or Don't? Leave your locker unlocked so it's easier to get into.
- Do or Don't? Watch a video on your phone while you're walking in the hallway.
- Do or Don't? Hang out in a quiet spot in the cafeteria to watch an online video while you eat lunch if you need a break from talking to people.
- Do or Don't? Use electronics without earbuds in the cafeteria.
- Do or Don't? Eat foods like casseroles with your fingers.
- Do or Don't? Eat foods like pizza or tacos with your hands.
- Do or Don't? Hang out in the hallway until after the one-minute bell rings, then run across the campus to your class.
- Do or Don't? Say "excuse me" if you bump into someone in the hallway.
- Do or Don't? Talk with your mouth full.
- Do or Don't? Get mad when teachers in hall when they tell you to get to class.
- Do or Don't? Carry your laptop open in the hallways during passing period.
- Do or Don't? Put in earbuds and play your music so loudly that you can't hear the late bell.
- Do or Don't? Hold the door open for the person coming into class behind you

If you draw a **BLACK** brick, **WHOO-HOO!** You just got a **FREE BRICK!**

If you draw a GREEN brick, answer one of these questions about the difference friends and acquaintances.

- Friend or Acquaintance? Your bus driver
- Friend or Acquaintance? The girl who sits next to you in English
- Friend or Acquaintance? Someone you hang out with outside of school every weekend
- Friend or Acquaintance? Someone whose house you get invited to often, and who you invite to your house, too
- Friend or Acquaintance? Someone your age who tells you personal things, and who you can trust with your personal secrets, too
- Friend or Acquaintance? Your favorite co-teacher at school
- Friend or Acquaintance? Someone you talk to every week at Lego Club and eat lunch with at school most days
- Friend or Acquaintance? Someone who follows you on Instagram
- Friend or Acquaintance? A Facebook friend who you don't hang out with in real life
- Friend or Acquaintance? Your therapist
- Friend or Acquaintance? Your community case manager
- Friend or Acquaintance? Someone you hang out with all the time
- Friend or Acquaintance? The guys you get together to play video games with, then go out for pizza every Saturday
- Friend or Acquaintance? Your new neighbor
- Friend or Acquaintance? The school counselor

- True or False? Don't bother to clean out your backpack.
- True or False? Don't charge your laptop every night because you can just plug it in when you get to school.
- True or False? It's okay to skip your prescribed medications if you don't feel like taking them; it probably won't impact your mood or brain function.
- True or False? Check your bag daily to make sure you have pencils, paper, and other necessary supplies for class.
- True or False? If you raise your hand to ask your Math teacher to show you how to work the problem again, she will probably think you're stupid
- True or False? If you have concerns about your grade, wait until the week before finals to go ask your teacher how to improve your grade.
- True or False? If a person has an IEP, that means he/she can turn in work whenever he/she feels like it and not have it counted late.
- True or False? Don't memorize your logins and passwords. The librarian and your teachers can just reset them several times per week.

- Okay or Awkward? Cheering on a classmate with an enthusiastic “WOO-HOO!” for answering correctly in class.
- Okay or Awkward? Clearing your sinuses during a quiet moment in class.
- Okay or Awkward? Picking your nose in public.
- Okay or Awkward? Holding the door open for the person coming in behind you.
- Okay or Awkward? Not closing the bathroom stall door.
- Okay or Awkward? Stopping to help someone pick up their dropped papers in the hall.
- Okay or Awkward? Slamming your hand repeatedly against your locker door when you can't get it open and swearing loudly.
- Okay or Awkward? Waving and saying “hi” when you pass someone you know from class in the hall.
- Okay or Awkward? Not responding when someone says hello to you.
- Okay or Awkward? Only talking about robots, dogs, or another specific topic all the time.

- Okay or Awkward? Always asking your classmates for pieces of paper, pencils, or other supplies in class.
- Okay or Awkward? Trying to make small talk with someone in the bathroom.
- Okay or Awkward? Pointing out a classmate's large pimple.
- Okay or Awkward? Helping someone wipe up a spill at your table in the cafeteria.
- Okay or Awkward? Leaving crumbs and other trash around your desk when you leave a class.

If you draw a YELLOW brick, you have drawn a SILLY CHALLENGE brick. If you meet the challenge presented, you will get 5 bricks!

- Sing "I'm a Little Teapot" (with the hand gestures)
- Cluck like a chicken
- Do the hand-jive dance from *Grease*
- Pantomime pouring a glass of water and drinking it
- Do 10 jumping jacks
- Walk a lap around the classroom
- Repeat the following tongue twister: Rubber baby buggy bumpers
- Stand up and sit down 5 times
- Sing "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star"
- Stand one leg for ten seconds
- Pantomime being trapped inside a box
- Shake hands with the teacher
- Do the "Whip/Nae Nae"
- Play a round of Rock, Paper, Scissors with the teacher. If you win, you get 10 BRICKS!!! If you lose, you get nothing. Or...just walk away and take 5 bricks.
- Trumpet like an elephant (along with the "trunk" arm gesture)
- Do a ten-second "freestyle dance"
- Do the "Chicken Dance"
- Do a beauty pageant wave
- Roll your tongue for 5 seconds (or try to)
- Hop like a bunny
